Rosera and Nearby Places:

- 1. Rosera is a Sub-divisional town on the bank of the river Budhi-Gandak. It is well connected by the rest of the country through railway and road network. It is 30 km from the district headquarters Samastipur and about 110 km from capital Patna via road. Rosera is connected to Begusarai (30 KM) via SH 55 and Darbhanga (45 KM) via SH 88.
- 2. There are 02 constituent degree college, 03 affiliated degree College, 11 Inter college, one constituent B.Ed. college and 01 affiliated B.Ed. College situated in Rosera Sub-District.
- 3. Vidyapati Nagar: Vidyapati Nagar has been named after the famous Maithili poet Vidyapati. According to beliefs, the legendary poet in his search of Ganga, breathed last at this place. Vidyapati Nagar is 30 km from Rosera.
- 4. Kanwar Lake (Jai Mangla Garh): This famous lake is 15 km from Rosera. It is spread over nearly 7,000 hectares; the lake has served as a destination for migratory birds and was home to several aquatic species. It was first declared a protected area by the State government in 1986, and later, a sanctuary by the Central Government, to prevent the poaching of birds.
- 5. Karpoori Gram: It is the birthplace of Freedom Fighter, renowned socialist leader and ex-Chief Minister of Bihar Bharat Ratn Karpoori Thakur. It is about 40 km from here.
- 6. *Kusheshwar Sthan:* Kusheshwar Sthan is a famous place for pilgrimage. This place is associated with Kush, a son of Lord Ram. There is an ancient temple of Lord Shiva here, which is called Ramayan regim. This place is about 42 km from here.
- 7. Ahalya Sthan: Ahalya Sthan is also an ancient and famous religious place about 85 km from Rosera. It is believed that here Ahalya, who was turned into stone due to the curse of Maharishi Gautam, was saved by Ram. The temple, in its present structural form was built between 1662 and 1682 during the rule of Maharaja Chhatra Singh and Maharaja Rudra Singh. This is also the first Ram Janaki temple in India.
